

Rules and Guidelines

Eligibility:

- Participants must be currently enrolled undergraduate students within the specific departments (Business, Architecture, and Engineering) to be eligible to apply.
- Minimum CGPA of 2.75.

Idea Criteria:

- Submissions should pertain to innovative and original business, architecture, or engineering ideas.
- The ideas submitted should not currently exist as fully operational businesses, architectural projects, or engineering endeavours.
- Ideas that have previously won in other competitions are not eligible for submission.

Submission Guidelines:

- Ideas must be submitted through the official Scholar Hunt submission platform within the designated timeframe.
- Each participant submits only one idea per background.
- Submissions should be detailed and clearly articulate the concept, its potential impact, and feasibility.
- Presentations or proposals should be in English, with clear visuals and explanations.

Intellectual Property:

- By submitting an idea, participants acknowledge that they retain the intellectual property rights to their concepts. However, the organising committee may request permission to showcase winning ideas for promotional purposes.

Evaluation Process:

- Submissions will be reviewed by a panel of judges appointed by the organizing committee.
- Evaluation criteria will include creativity, feasibility, potential impact, and overall presentation.
- Judges' decisions will be final and binding.

Confidentiality:

- While the organising committee will take reasonable measures to protect the confidentiality of submissions, participants should be aware that complete confidentiality cannot be guaranteed. Avoid disclosing sensitive proprietary information.

Prizes and Recognition:

- Prizes and recognition will be awarded to winning ideas, as determined by the organising committee.
- 9 winners, 3 from each department will win Tk 1 Lakh scholarship.

Code of Conduct:

- Participants are expected to maintain a respectful and professional demeanour throughout the competition.
- Plagiarism, cheating, or any unethical behaviour will result in immediate disqualification.
- The organising committee reserves the right to disqualify any participant or idea that violates the competition's rules or code of conduct.

Updates and Communication:

- Participants should regularly check the competition's official website or communication channels for updates, deadlines, and announcements.
